A Report from Wolf Den 6




Wolf Den 6 has had a busy month indeed. The wolves went on two trips: one to participate in the wildlife conservation program at the Hudson Highlands Nature Museum and the other to the Gustafson Planetarium at Sharpe Reservation.

At the Hudson Highlands Nature Museum, the boys learned all about the local ecosystems and the importance of conserving not only habitat, but all natural resources. It was a good time to introduce the Leave No Trace front country guidelines and the importance of each rule. The boys put most of this new information into use on our hike through the conservation center's trails. This fun filled day of learning and doing earned the boys their hiking belt loop, wildlife conservation belt loop, and wildlife conservation pin.

The trip to the Gustafson Planetarium was another great adventure, but this time the wolves were not alone. We had visitors from the rest of pack 40 and one from the old pack 25. The boys and their families participated in a fun tour of the night sky presented to us by Ms. Jill from the fresh air fund. All of the boys asked amazing questions and even stumped our expert a couple of times!
